

NETE 70000 Basics of Biblical Greek I  
(3 semester hours)

Prerequisites: None

Description of the Content: This course is a graduate-level introduction to New Testament Greek which will facilitate the student's learning sufficient vocabulary and grammar to enable her/him to study the New Testament in the Greek exegesis course offered the second or third year of course work. Some attention will also be given to Hellenistic writers such as Josephus and the Septuagint.

Class Procedures: Lecture

1. Weekly Assignments: Each student will be required to complete assigned translating exercises and hand them in at the next class.
2. Class preparation: Memorize—Each Student will be required to memorize the endings, paradigms, and declension of New Testament Greek
3. Weekly quizzes: Each student will be required to take regular quizzes and during the course of each semester.
4. A mid-semester and final examination: Each student will be required to take a mid-term and final examination.
