What *DOES* Revelation Reveal?

Warren Carter

Professor of New Testament, Brite Divinity School

The book of Revelation has long been a controversial one. Some obsess over it. Some are fearful of it. Some use it to threaten people. Some wish it left behind. How might we read it? This seminar will engage some of the troubling but important issues Revelation raises, such as the violence of Revelation's imaginary world, notions of judgment, the nature of religious language, cultural participation and accommodation in a world of empire and John's advocacy of cultural distance, and the universal extent of God's gracious purposes.



Warren Carter came to Brite after teaching for 17 years at Saint Paul School of Theology in Kansas City. His scholarly work has focused on the gospels of Matthew and John, and he has focused on the issue of the ways in which early Christians negotiated the Roman empire. He is a frequent speaker at scholarly and ecclesial conferences.
